WELCOME TO
THE 2010 CHAMPIONSHIPS
FROM THE CHAIRMEN

IT IS OUR PLEASURE TO WELCOME YOU TO THE 2010 Championships. Once again, the finest players from more than 60 countries will compete in the five main Championships events. In addition, the three Veteran and four Junior events will also contribute to the excitement for spectators at one of the world's greatest sporting events.

Although the major changes to Centre Court, including the roof, and the new Court 2 were completed for the 2009 Championships, work continues at the south of the Grounds. A new Court 3 will be open for the 2011 Championships together with new facilities for marquee hospitality guests and The All England Club's Groundstaff. For 2010, you should be aware that the southern courts have already been renumbered to accommodate the consequences of this work (please refer to the map in this Guide).

WELCOME

For safety and comfort reasons, we would ask that spectators do not use glass drinking vessels on the show courts; in addition, all drinks taken onto show courts or into the stands of any court should be covered to avoid spillage. Hot and/or strong smelling food will also be prohibited on the show courts.

It is once again necessary to implement comprehensive security measures for all those visiting The Championships; this will include:

- ★ *extensive searches on entry to the Grounds and the show courts*
- ★ *NO left luggage facilities inside the Grounds. Left luggage space will be provided outside and you are therefore encouraged to bring as small a bag as possible or at least leave yourself enough time to deposit any bags you do not require during the day at one of the outside facilities*
- ★ *travel restrictions. You are strongly recommended to use public transport wherever possible (please see the section ‘Travelling to The Championships’ which details the comprehensive options available).*

We know that these procedures may be inconvenient but we are equally sure that you will understand the need to protect the safety and security of all our visitors.

Play is scheduled to start on Centre and No.1 Courts at 1.00 p.m. for the first eleven days and at 2.00 p.m. on finals days. On all other courts the start of play will be scheduled for 12.00 noon for at least the first eight days and 11.00 a.m. for Junior matches on the middle Saturday and the start of the second week.

We hope you enjoy your visit to Wimbledon.

FACILITIES

- ★ Centre and No.1 Court debenture holders have their own bar and restaurant facilities which have been designed to be places in which to eat, drink and relax in stylish surroundings.
- ★ The Centre Court facilities offer debenture holders a variety of different bars and restaurants.
- ★ The newly refurbished No.1 Court debenture facility is within the No.1 Court building and overlooks grass courts 14–17.
- ★ Light refreshments are available in the debenture holders' bars and restaurants from 10.30 a.m. and lunch from 11.00 a.m. Payment may be made by credit card or cash.
- ★ Entrance to the facilities for either the Centre or No.1 Court is gained by showing your ticket together with your own particular court badge.
- ★ Centre Court and No.1 Court facilities have their own cloakrooms and toilets.
- ★ The dress code for admittance to the bars and restaurants is smart casual, see page 15 for further details.
- ★ Smoking is not permitted in any of the debenture holders' areas including outdoor balconies.

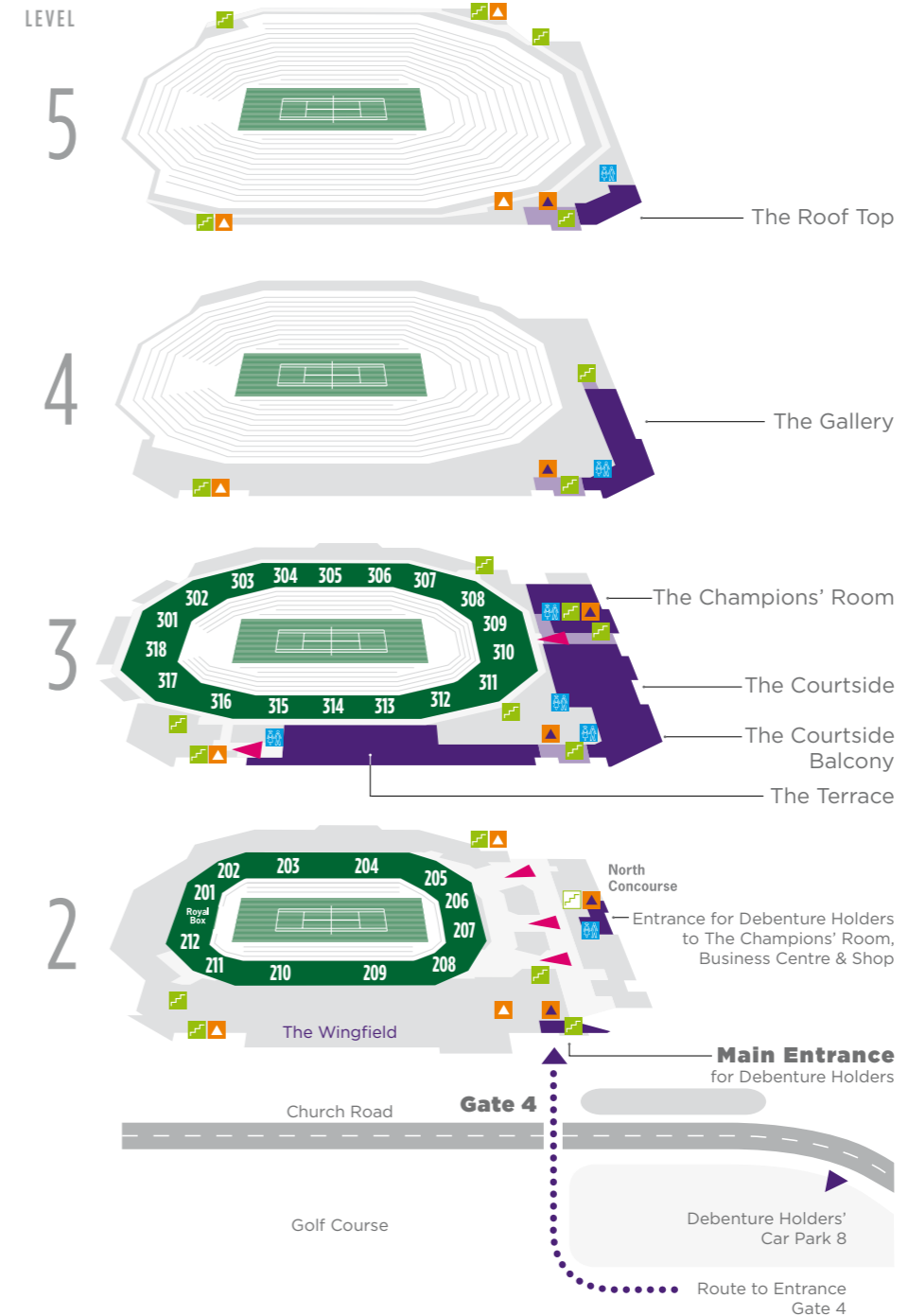

SAFETY & COMFORT

The Championships Grounds cover more than 40 acres and are built on land which is not totally level. As well as this, at certain times (for example, before, between and after matches as well as during periods of inclement weather), parts of the Grounds can become very busy. We therefore urge you to take care and to consider your own and others' safety and comfort by heeding the following advice:

- ★ wear appropriate footwear (note: flip-flops and high-heels are not recommended). This will help you as you make your way to and from the Grounds, enter and exit the stadia and negotiate some of the more challenging areas of the site, especially during, or as a result of, inclement weather.
- ★ allow good time to reach your seat, or any other destination, avoiding the need to rush through any crowded areas.
- ★ take particular care when negotiating stairways, both inside and outside the stadia and especially in crowded conditions. In common with most other sports and entertainment venues, there are no supporting rails to the tiered sections within the courts.
- ★ beware of extreme weather conditions; in particular, remember to take appropriate protective measures when spending periods in the sun. Wearing a hat, applying sunscreen regularly throughout the day and drinking plenty of water are all strongly recommended in such conditions.
- ★ do not leave any items unattended at any time.
- ★ if you face challenges/difficulties in negotiating distances or hilly ground, it may be easier for you to bring a wheelchair. If this is the case and you have tickets for a show court, please check to see if your tickets are in an area which accommodates wheelchairs. If not, you will be asked to leave the chair in a designated area and then access your seat by stairs or lift, if available. *Please note that neither the AELTC nor St John Ambulance provide wheelchairs for visitors.*

EMERGENCY EVACUATION

If you discover an accident, fire or suspect package etc. contact a member of staff or steward/guard immediately [or telephone ext.2666 or 020 8971 2666 from an external line or direct from a red emergency telephone]. Give your name, the nature of the incident and the location. The relevant emergency service(s) will be despatched immediately. If you are asked to evacuate a court or the Grounds, please leave by the nearest exit or as directed by uniformed stewarding staff, taking all your personal belongings with you. Please note that, in order to ensure the effectiveness of any emergency evacuation, the All England Club regrets that spectators using wheelchairs are only permitted access to designated areas within the stands. For the same reason, large picnic hampers, coolboxes or other large items will not be allowed into the stands and should be deposited in one of the left luggage offices outside the Grounds.

SECURITY & LEFT LUGGAGE

We constantly review our security procedures in the light of world events. There will be extensive searching on entry to the Grounds. There will be no general left luggage facilities inside the Grounds. However, debenture holders will be able to leave small items in the debenture holders' cloakrooms along with coats and umbrellas.

Only one bag per person will be allowed into the Grounds and this bag should measure no more than 45cm x 30cm x 30cm in size. No hard-sided items (e.g. picnic hampers, coolboxes or briefcases) of any size will be allowed into the Grounds. Left luggage space for items that exceed the size or style restriction will be provided outside and

you are therefore encouraged to leave yourself enough time to deposit any bags you do not require during the day at one of the outside facilities. We know that these procedures may be inconvenient but we are equally sure that you will understand the need to protect the safety and security of all our visitors.

DRESS CODE

FOR DEBENTURE BARS & RESTAURANTS

The dress code for admittance to the bars and restaurants is smart casual. In particular, we request that you and your guests do not wear torn jeans, running vests, dirty trainers or sports shorts (tailored shorts for both ladies and gentlemen are acceptable). Gentlemen are not required to wear a jacket and/or tie. All debenture tickets have details of the dress code printed on them.

WORLD CUP FOOTBALL

We will not be showing World Cup football matches on the televisions within the debenture facilities during The Championships fortnight. Equally, football matches will not be shown on the giant television screen on the Hill or in any other public areas within the Grounds.

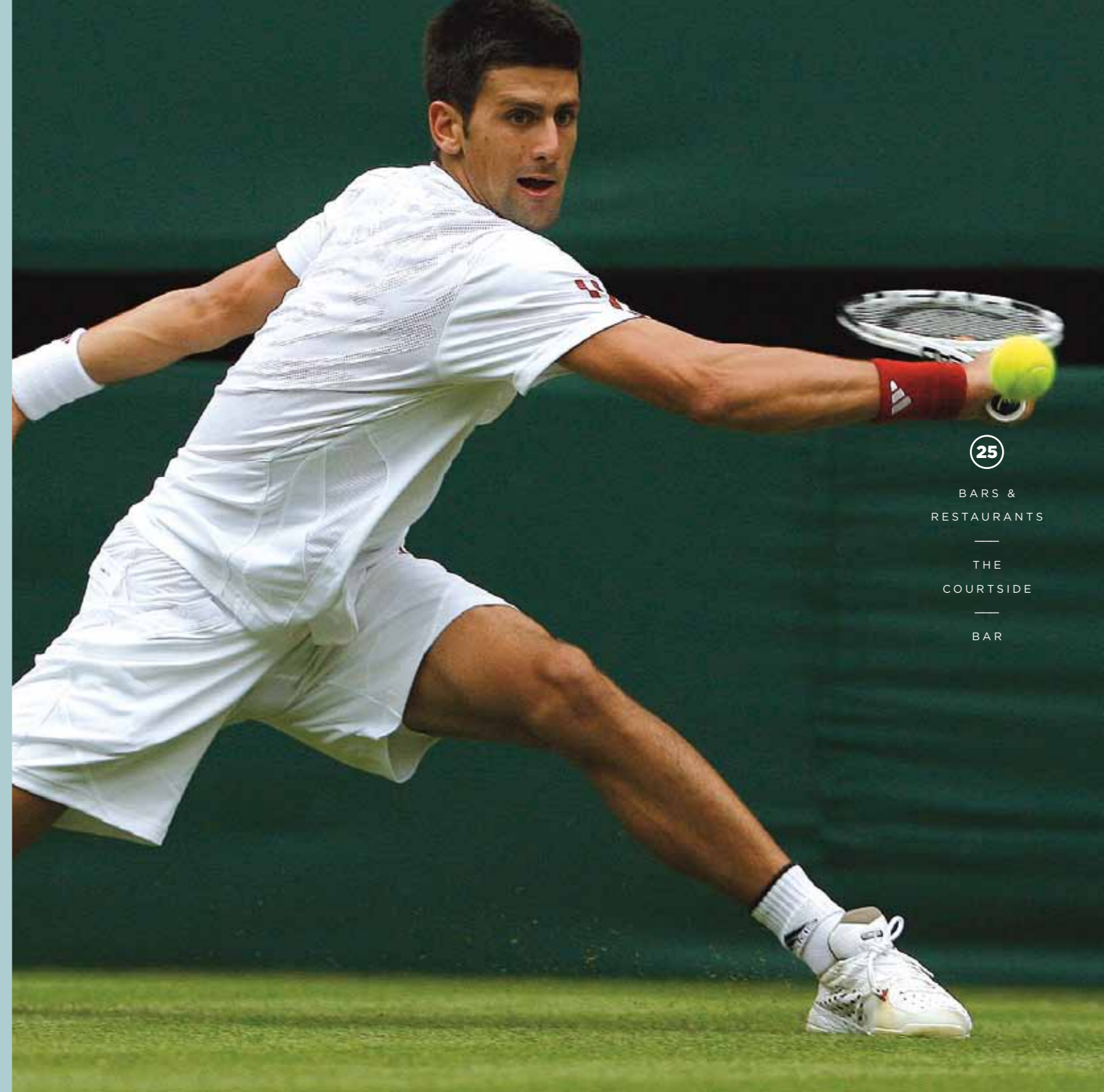

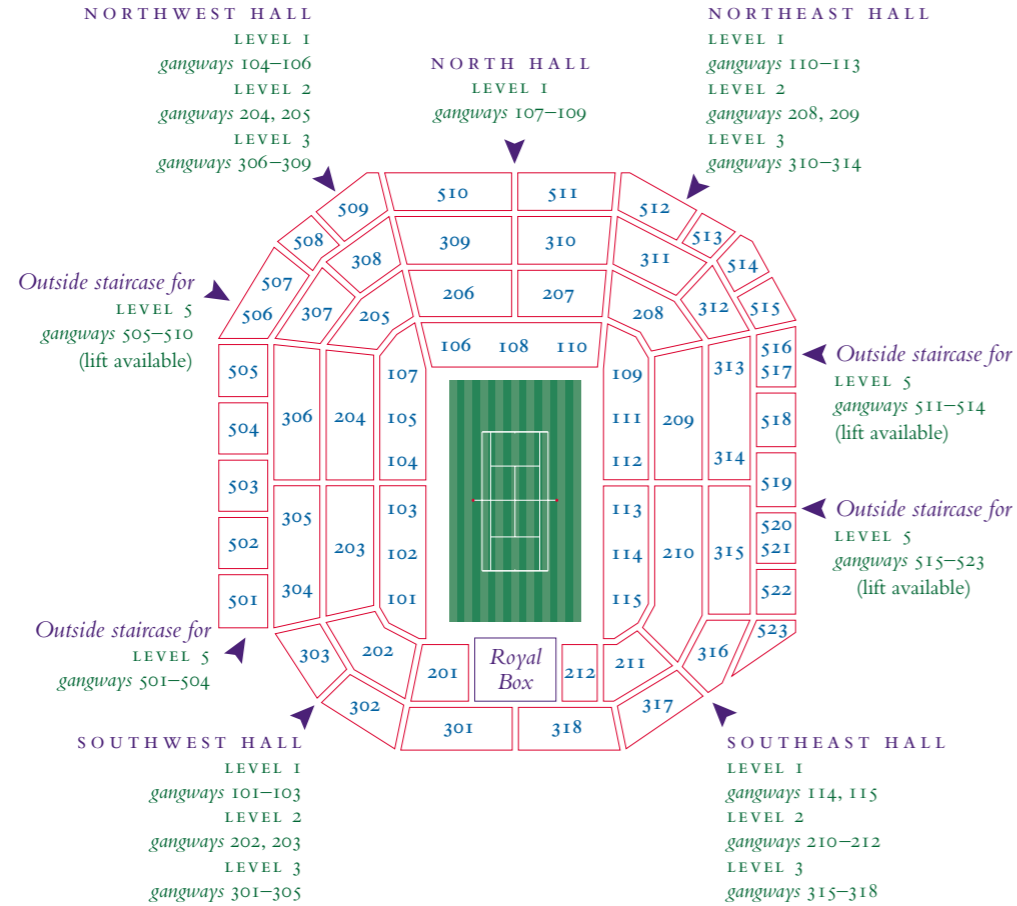

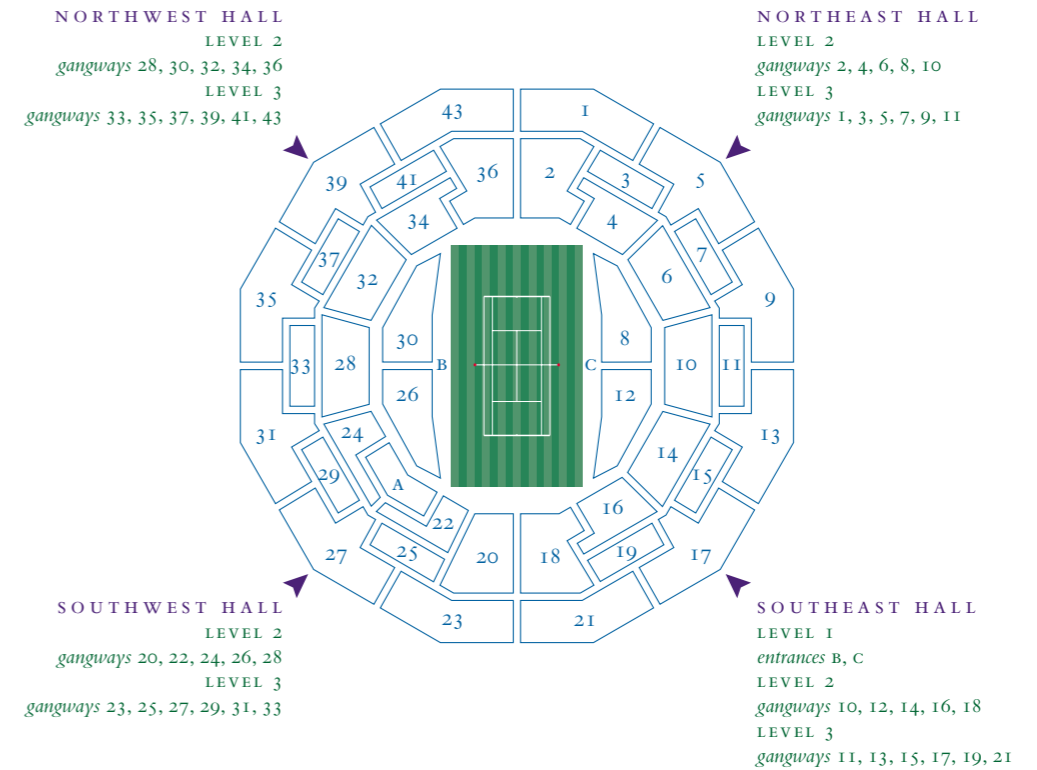

CHANGES TO THE ORDER OF PLAY

We do try to play all matches on the courts and days published. However, occasionally it is necessary to switch a match from one court to another. This can be for a number of reasons. For example:

- ★ *We aim to complete The Championships on time and this involves playing 662 matches, in the 14 events, over the 13 days of the tournament.*
- ★ *Some players remain involved in several events towards the end of The Championships and it may be necessary to move a match to avoid a clash.*
- ★ *We try to give similar rest periods between matches for players due to play each other.*
- ★ *A match which is unlikely to finish because of a late start caused by the duration of previous matches may be postponed to the following day. In this event, another match may be substituted.*

We recognise that this may be frustrating for debenture holders and we apologise for the rare occasions when circumstances necessitate a change to the published Order of Play. We hope you will appreciate why such changes sometimes are made.

CANCELLATION OF PLAY DUE TO RAIN

- ★ In the event of bad weather resulting in tennis being played for less than one hour, a refund will be paid to debenture holders of the face value ticket price for that

day from £41 to £104 for Centre Court debenture holders and from £38 to £72 for No.1 Court debenture holders depending on the day.

- ★ If there is more than one hour's play but less than two hours' play, a refund will be made of half the relevant amount.
- ★ The refund will be paid out automatically 4 to 6 weeks after the last day of The Championships to all debenture holders who are entitled to a refund.
- ★ Cheques will be drawn, made payable to the registered debenture holder (as per the Debenture Register at the start of The Championships) and, in the case of joint holders, to the first named debenture holder.
- ★ Debenture holders who sell back tickets to the Club on the official market for any rained off day(s) will not be entitled to a refund. Debenture holders who buy additional tickets from us on the official market will, however, be entitled to the appropriate refund.
- ★ If play is arranged for any additional day(s), details will be published at the earliest opportunity on www.wimbledon.org and in the national press.
- ★ All debenture holders will be notified, under separate cover, of entrance procedures, should play be scheduled for any additional day(s).
- ★ The cancellation of play due to rain policy does not apply to tickets for any days other than the 13 scheduled days of The Championships.

THE LONG TERM PLAN

Since the 2009 Championships, work has progressed at the southern end of our Grounds towards the creation of a new Court 3, together with a new Court 4 on the other side of the extended St Mary's Walk.

New Court 3, a 2,000 seat open bowl stadium, with commentary and TV camera positions and two large screens, will be opened in 2011. Underneath the terracing will be amenities such as public toilets and a lost property office.

New Court 4, like new Court 3, is also scheduled to open in 2011, but for 2010 the concrete base will take a temporary grandstand to enable Court 5 to be scheduled as a show court.

St Mary's Walk is the major pedestrian access route running from the top of Aorangi Terrace past Centre Court down to the southern courts. For 2010 it has been extended to the south end of Court 8 to make it much easier for spectators to move around this part of the Grounds.

As part of the same project, other facilities at the southern end of the Grounds are also under construction, including a single storey Facilities Building, as well as a new Groundsman's Office, Maintenance Workshop and related storage.

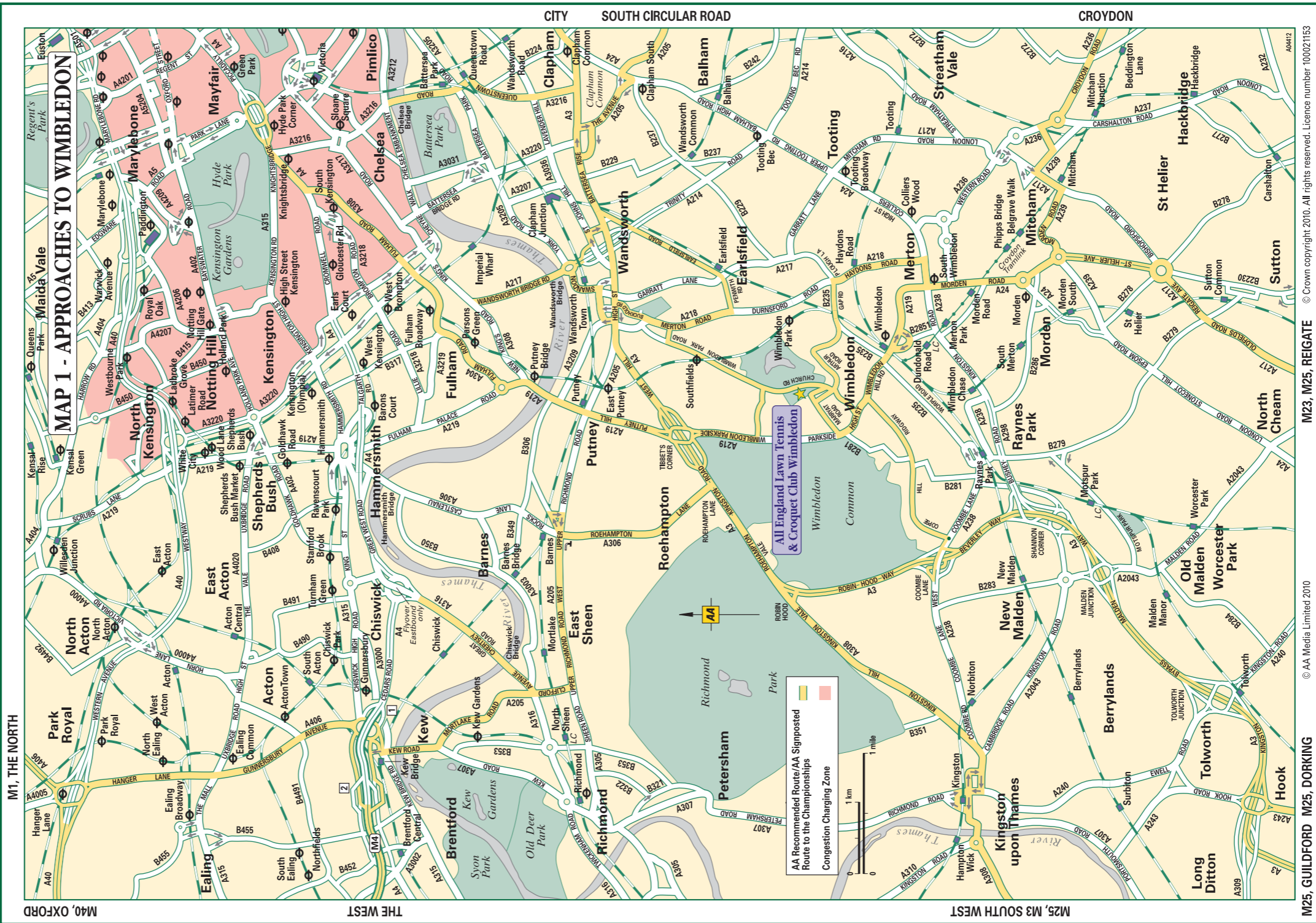

Taxis—Taxi services to the Grounds operate throughout The Championships from the taxi ranks at Southfields and Wimbledon Stations. A shuttle service back to local stations also operates from the taxi rank in Church Road (outside Gate 4), heading north, as well as services to all other destinations. An additional rank is situated in Somerset Road (outside Gate 13) for journeys heading south. Taxi sharing is encouraged during peak times.

Debenture Holders’ Car Park—Car Park 8 has an area especially reserved for debenture holders. Late bookings for berths can be obtained directly from the AA by calling them on 01256 493535 right up to the start of The Championships.

ACCESS TO THE GROUNDS

Babies—We recommend that babes in arms and pushchairs are not brought to The Championships as the Grounds are large and crowded. However, a ticket is not required for those under 5. Babes in arms and children under 5 are NOT allowed into the Show Courts (Centre, No.1 and No.2 Courts and Courts 5, 12 & 18). A limited number of baby changing facilities are available but there are no facilities for mothers to ‘express’ milk. (See also ‘Children’ below).

Bank (HSBC)—situated just to the north of Gate 3 and open each day of The Championships from Ground opening to 8.00 p.m. Automatic till machines are also available in the Bank, in the North Concourse and outside Gate 1.

Bicycles—public bicycle racks are available free, at the owner’s risk, in Car Parks 6 & 8. Bicycles left in other areas will be removed by the Police.

Children—A ticket (full price) is required for all children aged 5 years old and over.

Children in this category are allowed into all courts provided that they have their own seat and do not disturb other spectators. NOTE: Children under 12 years MUST BE ACCOMPANIED by an adult at ALL TIMES.

Cushions—Souvenir cushions are available from The Wimbledon Shops.

Drinking Water—see map on pages 8 & 9 for the location of drinking water fountains.

First Aid Posts—the St John Ambulance Brigade runs four First Aid posts (see map on pages 8 & 9).

Information Desks—a wide variety of information is available from six points around the Grounds.

Lawn Tennis Association—details of membership (British Tennis Membership), literature and other information are available from the British Tennis Information Area in No.1 Court (Level 1) near Gate 3.

Left Luggage—left luggage facilities are provided at a number of locations OUTSIDE the Grounds. Camping equipment, oversize bags, picnic hampers and other prohibited items or bags not required during your visit to The Championships must be left in one of these facilities. In the interests of security and the safety of all our visitors, THERE ARE NO LEFT LUGGAGE FACILITIES INSIDE THE GROUNDS.

Lost Property—a Lost Property Office is situated under Court 3 West Stand—near Gate 13. Telephone enquiries 020 8971 2251.

Museum—The Museum Building is at Gate 3. The Wimbledon Lawn Tennis Museum is open daily throughout the year (10.00 a.m.–5.00 p.m.) and, for ticket holders only, during The Championships from 10.30 a.m. to 8.00 p.m. ADMISSION: *Adults*—£10.00; *OAPs, students and concessions*—£8.75; *children under 16*—£5.50.

Newsagent—newspapers (English and foreign) and magazines are available from the kiosk in No.1 Court (Level 1) near Gate 3.

Order of Play & Results—the full draw of the main Championships events, the daily order of play and results to date are displayed in the piazza inside Gate 3 (the turnstile entrance) and outside the Debenture Holders' Lounge at the north side of Centre Court. Scoreboards showing point by point scores for matches on Centre and No.1 Courts are located on the main concourse and outside the No.1 Court Stadium. Full match information displays are available on the Main Concourse opposite Court 4 and near Gate 5. Television monitors showing up to date scores, results and other public information are situated around the Grounds.

Pass-outs—to exit and re-enter the Grounds a valid ticket and the appropriate wristband are required. Pass-out wristbands are available at most gates.

Pharmacy—toiletries, pharmaceuticals and photographic services are available from the kiosk in No.1 Court (Level 1) near Gate 3.

Photography—photographs (still or motion) taken inside the Grounds may only be used for private, not commercial, purposes.

Picnic Hampers—see *Security* below.

Play Tennis—interactive game, set and match fun for kids south of Court 12

Police—a Metropolitan Police office is located in the North Hall of Centre Court.

Programmes—official programmes, containing daily order of play, essential information and articles about The Championships, may be purchased from kiosks around the Grounds. Final programmes are available from PPL Sport & Leisure, Bradford House, 39A East Street, Epsom, Surrey KT17 1BL.

Radio Wimbledon—on air, daily from 8.00 a.m., throughout The Championships

providing latest scores, match reports, background information, local traffic and weather news, broadcasting live on 87.7FM to a 4-5 mile radius from Wimbledon. Two further channels broadcast match commentaries from Centre Court (96.3FM) and No.1 Court (97.8FM).

Security—in the interests of security The All England Club reserves the right to search bags, vehicles and the person as a condition of entry to the Grounds. One bag only per person will be allowed and this bag must measure no more than 18" x 12" x 12" (45cm x 30cm x 30cm). Further, no hard-sided items (e.g. picnic hampers, coolboxes or briefcases) of any size will be allowed into the Grounds. Do not leave packages unattended at any time.

Shopping—the Wimbledon Shops, in the Centre and No.1 Court Stadia, between Gates 3 & 4 and in kiosks around the Grounds, stock all official Wimbledon merchandise and a wide range of gifts and souvenirs; the funds generated contribute towards the further development of lawn tennis in Great Britain.

Show Courts—Centre Court, No.1 Court, No.2 Court and Courts 5, 12 & 18 are defined as the ‘show courts’.

Speed of Service Net—try your service, compared with the professionals, at the Play Tennis marquee (proceeds to charity).

Telephones, Public—located inside the Grounds near Gates 4 and 13, in the No.1 Court stadium and outside the Grounds near Gate 9 and in Marryat Road.

Television Screen—a giant television screen shows current matches and tennis information to all areas of the Aorangi Terrace.

Toilets—see map on pages 8 & 9 for the toilet facilities which are available throughout the Grounds.

Transport—**Buses**—for Wimbledon station leave from Somerset Road, by Gate 11; for Southfields station leave from the terminal near Gate 1 on Church Road. **Underground**—the nearest underground stations are Southfields (to the north—approx. 15 minute walk), Wimbledon (to the south—approx. 20 minute walk); both on the District Line. **Taxis**—in Church Road outside Gate 4 (heading north) and in Somerset Road outside Gate 13 (heading south). **Tram**—‘Tramlink’ runs regularly between Croydon and suburbs and Wimbledon Station.

Weather/Sun—Visitors to The Championships are reminded to take the appropriate measures for protection of the skin against the sun. You may be in sunlight for long periods when the use of sunscreens and protective hats and clothes is essential. However, even on warm days, it may be cooler in the covered and/or shaded areas of the stands in Centre and No.1 Courts and an extra layer of clothing may be required. (See also *Safety & Comfort at The Championships* page 14.)

Wimbledon Village—a short walk from The Championships and you will discover an excellent selection of restaurants and public houses together with many specialist and exclusive shops.

Wheelchairs—a special map/information leaflet is available at all gates. The recommended routes are shown on the map. Wheelchairs may only be taken into designated positions in the show courts.

There will be reserved spaces for wheelchair users on Centre and No.1 Court, No.2 Court and Court 3 at the 2011 Championships. A leaflet explaining how to enter the ballot for these spaces is available from either of the Gate 3 or Centre Court (sw) Information Desks during The Championships.

ADVICE TO SPECTATORS

DO

- ★ *leave prohibited items at Left Luggage*
- ★ *switch off mobile telephones in the stands and around the courts*
- ★ *hand in or offer your ticket for scanning, for resale on behalf of charity, as you leave the Grounds.*

DO NOT

- ★ *buy tickets from touts (Schwarzhändler, Bacarinagios, Scalpers, ダフ屋), they will not gain you entry. Tickets are checked at all entry gates.*
- ★ *enter or leave the stands except at a change of ends and NOT during a tie-break*
- ★ *make a noise during a rally*
- ★ *applaud a net cord or double fault*
- ★ *use flash photography from the stands—automatic flashlights must be suppressed*
- ★ *bring babes in arms into any show court*
- ★ *smoke within the stands of any court or in any enclosed space.*
- ★ *take glass or uncovered drinks containers or hot and/or strong smelling food onto the show courts*

EMERGENCY

If you discover an accident, fire or suspect package etc. CONTACT A MEMBER OF STAFF OR STEWARD/GUARD IMMEDIATELY [or telephone ext.2666 or 020 8971 2666 from an external line or direct from a red emergency telephone]. Give your name, the nature of the incident and the location. The relevant emergency service(s) will be despatched immediately.

EVACUATION

If you are asked to evacuate a court or the Grounds, please leave by the nearest exit or as directed by uniformed stewarding staff, taking all your personal belongings with you. Please note that, in order to ensure the effectiveness of any emergency evacuation, the All England Club regrets that spectators using wheelchairs are only permitted access to designated areas within the stands.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY TO THE GROUNDS

Entry to the Grounds of The All England Lawn Tennis & Croquet Club (AELTC) requires a valid ticket or pass, which must be retained at all times and implies acceptance of the following conditions which have been established for the safety and enjoyment of all our visitors and may be amended from time to time:

SECURITY

The AELTC reserves the right to limit items which may be brought into the Grounds **and to search bags, vehicles and the person** before granting entry to the Grounds and other specific facilities.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

The following items are prohibited from the Grounds of the AELTC: * any bag exceeding 18" x 12" x 12" (45cm x 30cm x 30cm); * hard-sided items of any size; * any item which may be interpreted as a potential weapon including sharp or pointed objects (e.g. knives, large corkscrews) and 'personal protection' sprays; * large flags (over 2' x 2'), banners, rattles, klaxons or oversized hats; * any objects or clothing bearing political statements or commercial identification intended for 'ambush marketing'.

Visitors in possession of prohibited items may be refused entry or ejected from the Grounds. Prohibited items may be left in the Left Luggage facilities outside the Grounds or handed to AELTC security staff for disposal.

ALCOHOL & REFRESHMENTS

Alcohol may be brought into the Grounds but is limited to the equivalent of one bottle of wine or two 500ml cans of beer per person. The consumption of alcohol is permitted only in public bars and other authorised areas. Glass drinking vessels may not be used on the Show Courts; all drinks taken onto the Show Courts must be covered to avoid spillage. Hot and/or strong smelling food may not be taken onto the Show Courts. The AELTC reserves the right to refuse entry to the stands of any court to anyone carrying alcohol and to ask anyone drinking alcohol in the stands to leave.

BEHAVIOUR

The use of any annoying or dangerous behaviour, foul or abusive language, obscene gestures, the removal of shirts or any clothing likely to cause offence and the climbing onto any building, wall or other structure/equipment and the use of wheeled footwear is forbidden and may result in ejection from the Grounds.

COURTS

Unauthorised persons are not permitted on the courts at ANY time.

PHOTOGRAPHY

The use of photographic equipment must not inconvenience any other person in the Grounds. Still photographs, film, videotape or other audio-visual material recorded within the Grounds may not be sold or used commercially in any way whatsoever unless authorised by the AELTC and may be confiscated by the Club if such sale or commercial use is suspected.

MOBILE TELEPHONES, COMMUNICATION DEVICES & RADIOS

The use of mobile telephones, communication devices or radios must not inconvenience any other person in the Grounds; in particular they must be SWITCHED OFF in and around the courts in play. Personal headphones must be used when listening to radios inside the Grounds.

TICKETS

Championships tickets may not be bought, sold or distributed without lawful authority.

FILMING & BROADCASTING AT THE CHAMPIONSHIPS

During the Wimbledon fortnight, various filming, photography and broadcasting takes place. By your presence at The Championships, you grant your permission for your likeness and voice to be included on film and their exploitation and advertising without compensation or credit.

THE AELTC RESERVES THE RIGHT FOR ITS SERVANTS, AGENTS AND POLICE OFFICERS TO REMOVE FROM THE GROUNDS ANY PERSON WHO CONTRAVENES THE ABOVE 'CONDITIONS OF ENTRY' AND ANY PERSON WHOSE PRESENCE AND/OR BEHAVIOUR IN THE GROUNDS COULD REASONABLY BE CONSTRUED AS DANGEROUS, A NUISANCE OR ANNOYANCE TO ANY OTHER PERSON IN THE GROUNDS.
